

TOWN OF ANGELICA

Annual Meeting

April 19, 2022

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Also, all property owners received notice of the meeting along with the Annual Financial Report that was mailed to them at the beginning of April. *Clerk Przybylski Note: The notice of the meeting was posted on April 14, 2022 at the town hall and also on the town's website.*

Copies of the minutes of last year's meeting were available to those present for review. *MOTION (Todd Javoroski/Brian Eckberg/PASSED)* to dispense with reading of the minutes of last year's annual meeting. *MOTION (Todd Javoroski/Brian Eckberg/PASSED)* to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2021 annual meeting as presented.

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf introduced Bob Egerer, representative for N.E.W. Para-Medic Rescue, Inc. to report on 2021 activities of the N.E.W. Para-Medic Rescue, Inc. The squad had 661 responses for services with 71 for the Town of Angelica. There were 429 transports and 212 no transports. The average response time for the Town of Angelica is 9.28 minutes. There was a positive fund balance of \$35,601.45 for 2021, with the Town of Angelica receiving \$4,722.85 back. 2022 budget is 19.62 per capita.

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf introduced Brian Killinger, representative of the Pulaski Tri-County Fire Department, and gave a report on activities of the Pulaski Tri-County Fire Department for 2021. The Department is currently staffed with 37 volunteer members, four of which reside in the Town of Angelica. There were 205 runs in 2021 compared to 152 in 2020 with the Town having 20 runs. The Town of Angelica's operating cost less reimbursement for fire runs and the two percent reimbursement from the State was \$37,908.17. The 2022 Fire Department budget shows a 2.02% increase for its operating and equipment expenses. The Department received a DNR grant of \$1,398.49 in 2021 that was used for Wildland Firefighting Equipment. Purchases and activity for 2021 include participating in fire prevention week with the local elementary schools, assisted the VFW/Legion at their golf outing and continue to support and do safety during the Pulaski Polka Days. Projects planned for 2022 are applying for DNR grant, replacement of our existing ladder truck with a newer/upgraded ladder truck, joint training center for the Packerland Fire District, applied for an AFG (Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program) grant, updating the apparatus floor with epoxy for safety, and acquiring tools for the station and updating equipment with the Firefighters donation proceeds. Packerland Fire District training is continuing on a quarterly basis with the new training center near Howard Fire Station #2.

Copies of the annual financial report for the year ending December 31, 2021 has previously been mailed to all town property owners and copies were available at this meeting. *MOTION (James Przybylski/Greg Van Asten/PASSED)* to dispense with reading of the financial report. There were no questions in regard to the report. *MOTION (Brian Eckberg/Dwayne Splan/PASSED)* to accept the 2021 Financial Report as presented.

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf introduced town of Angelica Planning Commission Chair, Dwayne Splan. Dwayne reported on the Lewis wedding barn, Nutrition Service starting an oil

refinery on the property at W164 Deer Drive. The planning commission has a five member board, with about 3 to 4 meetings a year. Shawano County and the Town of Angelica have updated their zoning ordinance and comprehensive plans recently and members are getting familiar with the new changes.

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf introduced newly elected County Board Supervisor District 11, James Przybylski, James reported on the County receiving just under \$8 million in ARPA funds (American Rescue Plan Act). County plans for the ARPA funds are updating the Shawano County Highway department building on Richmond Street, blacktop screed machine, possible library renovation or new building, \$3 raise for employees who work at the jail. Sheriff department will be purchasing four new cars and looking a five year plan for replacement of cars. Restructured the health insurance and saved \$600,000; with the money saved, it will be used to give wage increases. Court system hired temporary case employees to cut down on backlog on cases.

Town Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf reported that Open Book is scheduled for Thursday, August 18, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Board of Review is scheduled for Thursday, August 25, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Tire pickup is Friday, April 22 and Saturday, April 23.

Chairperson Richard Kucksdorf reported on the road work scheduled for 2022. The town will be resurfacing and shouldering Apple Road, Hill Drive, Grove Street, Stanley Street (Hoff Street to the Dead End), Lake Sandia Boulevard, and Deer Drive. All roads in the budget depend on the present cost with the increase of the blacktop this year.

GENERAL DISCUSSION AND ACTON TOPICS:

Wilbert Lewis asked about how far Deer Drive will be resurfaced. The town is planning on resurfacing and ditching from Highway 32 to the middle driveway of Nutrition Service, 1865'. Brian Eckberg asked about getting input from residents about soft spots or issues on the roads before the town resurfaces the roads.

MOTION (James Przybylski/Susan Pomprowitz/PASSED) to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m. In attendance were 14 residents, 1 non-resident representative from N.E.W. Para-Medic Rescue and 2 non-resident representative from Pulaski Tri County Fire Department. Refreshments were served courtesy of the Town Officials.
