

ATV/UTV Trail: means a marked corridor on public property or on private lands subject to public easement or lease, designated for use by ATV/UTV operators by the governmental agency having jurisdiction, but excluding roadways of highways except those roadways that are seasonally not maintained for motor vehicle traffic.

Designated Adult: parent, guardian or adult designated by the parent or guardian.

Section 5. Application:

This ordinance is binding on all individuals traveling in and through the Town of Angelica in any manner on any and all marked Town roads. Any cost associated with the opening of County Roads shall be paid by the requesting club.

Section 6. Route:

All town roads in the Town of Angelica are open to ATV/UTV's, unless posted otherwise. This does not include private roads or driveways. Does not include private property in the Town of Angelica. The aforesaid ATV/UTV Routes shall be open for ATV/UTV operation 24 hours per day, 365 days of the year. Any/all ATV/UTV Routes may be suspended at the discretion of the board at any time.

Section 7. Laws:

The Town of Angelica accepts no liability for the operation of ATV/UTV's on any Town road under the provisions of this Ordinance.

ATV/UTV's that operate on the aforementioned roads shall abide by all state laws regulating ATV/UTV's operation including the following:

- A. Operate in the extreme right hand portion of the traveled part of the road and single file
- B. Speed limit shall not exceed 35 mph. EXCEPT within 150 feet of a home or dwelling or 100 feet of a pedestrian when the speed SHALL NOT exceed 10 mph.
- C. Signs shall be posted to notify operators of ATV/UTV's and to notify motorists that ATV/UTV's may be traveling these roads. It requires the posting of signs along the ATV/UTV Route shall be the responsibility of the local ATV/UTV Club or Clubs. The signs must be placed at every entrance to the town and display dates of operation.
- D. ATV/UTV's operated on Town roads pursuant to this Ordinance shall have the following properly working equipment:
 1. one or more headlights
 2. off road auxiliary lighting not allowed
 3. a red rear light
 4. number plate bracket
 5. brakes in good mechanical condition.
 6. a muffler system and such other equipment or devices that comply with the noise level standards as set forth in 23 V.S.A. §3505(b), and regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
- E. ATV/UTV's operated on Town roads shall be currently registered by the State of Wisconsin in accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes. Registration does not constitute a license to cross or operate an ATV/UTV on public or private lands.
- F. General Age & Safety Certificate Requirements:
 1. ATV's – All ATV operators at least age 12 and born on or after January 1, 1988 must possess a valid ATV safety certificate issued by the State of Wisconsin or any other state or province. All ATV safety certified operators age 12-15 must also be accompanied by an adult while operating on a designated ATV Route.
 2. UTV's – All UTV operators at least age 12 and born on or after January 1, 1988 must possess a valid ATV safety certificate issued by the State of Wisconsin or any other state or province. Children age 12-15 years may only operate small UTV's (200 ccs or less) on public, off-road ATV Trails only. The child may cross roads at trail crossings, however no other roadway operation is allowed. The child must be accompanied by a designated adult.
- G. Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, a person may only operate or permit an ATV/UTV owned by him or under their control to be operated in accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes and all regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
