Public Meeting

March 5, 2015

Town of Angelica Committee Present: Chairman Richard Smith, Secretary Connie Nischke, Barb McKeefry, Dwayne Splan, Neal VanDonsel.

The meeting of the Angelica Planning Committee was called to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Larry Sperberg of L.J. Sperberg Construction was present to ask for a five year renewal for the conditional use permit for the Zernicke Quarry on Mile Drive in Pulaski (CU-24-01). Parcel #004-020130-0000 and #004-20240-0000. The committee reviewed every condition on his current permit and decided everything should remain the same. A question came up as to whether the renewal is for 3 years or 5 years. Nischke said she would check into it and let the Angelica Town Board know what the Shawano County ruling is on it. No one was present to oppose the request.

Dwayne Splan made a motion to extend the renewal for the maximum amount of years that the County allows for the quarry operation (CU-24-01), Barb McKeefry seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

A Motion was made by McKeefry and seconded by VanDonsel to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously at 8:00 p.m. The next meeting will be April 7, 2015, unless no action is necessary.

Conditions for CU-24-01 (L.J. Sperberg Construction – Zernicke Quarry)

1. Reclamation of the site to be accomplished in accordance with provisions and requirements of Wisconsin Administrative Code NR135, effective 6-1-01 (East Central Planning).
2. A Silt screen shall be placed and maintained throughout the quarry operation, in such a manner so to prevent run-off into the Pensaukee River/wetlands located north of site. *
3. No hauling of material out of the pit is permitted during the period of March 1 to May 1 of any year.
4. Operation of the quarry to be conducted in such a manner so to avoid any nuisance effect to adjacent property.
5. The approval will expire in 5 years, (6-6-20), at which time the applicant may request a 5 year extension.
6. The committee may, at any time, amend or add conditions to this permit to ensure compliance with all applicable legal requirements.
7. A bond be put up for \$5,000 to help defray road cost when it gets redone.

** The operator gives the Town of Angelica permission to spot check at any time for compliance with the requirement for silt screening in the quarry.
