Monthly Meeting

October 10, 2022

Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Roll Call/Verification of Meeting Notice: Chairperson Kucksdorf called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Roll call resulted in all town officials being shown as present. The Clerk verified that the agenda was posted at the town hall, on the town's website, e-mailed to the Shawano Leader, on Friday, October 7, 2022. *MOTION (Van Asten/Przybylski/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to allow modification of the agenda if necessary.*

Approval of Prior Town Board Minutes: *MOTION (Van Asten/Przybylski/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting held on September 12, 2022.*

Approval of Treasurer's Monthly Report: The Treasurer's report was read by Clerk Przybylski showing balances as of September 30, 2022 of \$29,511.99 in the Premier Checking Account, \$235,375.95 in the Premier Bank Advantage Tax Account and \$534,074.23 in the CoVantage ATC Account, \$13,778.90 in the CoVantage Cemetery Money Market Account, \$10 in the CoVantage Cemetery Saving Account, and \$11.42 in the CoVantage ATC Savings Account. *MOTION (Przybylski/Van Asten/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to approve the Treasurer's report as presented.*

Correspondence & Clerk's Report: Clerk Przybylski presented correspondence received which consisted of (1) Final estimate for population in the Town of Angelica is 1840 (2) three fire incident reports from the Pulaski Tri County Fire department (3) one Conditional approval for building at Riesterer & Schnell from the Dept. of Safety and Professional Services (4) interest rates for CD from the treasurer (5) map from WE Energies for installation of the natural gas in the hamlet of Angelica (6) Bonduel EMS monthly report for August and September. Clerk Przybylski also gave sample ballots for the November 8 General Election.

Reports from Town Officers: Supervisor Przybylski Road Maintenance asked the Chair to consider shouldering sections of east Middle Drive, Spruce Road, and Beech Drive. Allan Maroszek said he could bend the guard rail back on Nichols Drive for a cost of \$750. GEI Consultants recommended cutting the blacktop to separate it from the driveway and check when repaving Lake Sandia. Pothole list is W Deer Drive, Elm Road, Green Valley Road, Middle Drive, and Park Street. There are missing signs on Pine Road, Dead End sign; Hickory Drive, Narrow Bridge sign; Elm Road, intersection sign before Deer Drive; and stop ahead before Highway 160. Supervisor Przybylski supervisor report (1) received a call from a resident about a barking dog in Krakow. Recommended talking to the neighbor or call dispatch and file complaint (2) received a call about tree stumps near the ditch on Town Line Road. Owner will call diggers hotline and WE Energies to find lines (3) received a complaint about the yard lights at Challenge the Outdoor property. Called the owner and recommended he call planning & zoning for box light requirements (4) attended the Wisconsin Towns Association Unit meeting and they talked about recycling at the town level could raise more revenue to offset the garbage costs (5) attended law conference by zoom. Talked about dealing with nuisance properties, storm water regulations, and code of ethics for local public officials (6) received a complaint about noise from ATVs racing on neighbor's property. Recommended calling dispatch to file a complaint if after 10pm or extra load noise (7) recommend sanding main intersections only in Krakow to cut down on sweeping sand in the spring.

Supervisor Van Asten (1) received a complaint about a dog running loose around in Krakow, and recommended talking to neighbor or calling the animal control person (2) received a complaint about a cat killing birds in a back yard feeder, and recommended talking to the neighbor (3) Michaels Construction called about the catch basin in Angelica and recommended they call Shawano County. Michaels is installing the gas line in Angelica (4) received a question about zoning in regards to separating a house from a larger parcel (4) attended Wisconsin Towns Association meeting.

Town Chairman: Chairperson Kucksdorf talked about sitting on the side of Green Valley Road. He seen eight walkers and two bicyclists. Chairperson Kucksdorf emailed the Shawano County Sheriff department and had a squad sit on Green Valley Road, Two traffic violations were issued, one driving 83 mph and one 70 mph. I also went back to talk to walking residents about the traffic and residents said they thought speed seemed better. Chairperson Kucksdorf also attended the Wisconsin Towns Association unit meeting. Chairperson Kucksdorf asked about who issues violations for residents not recycling. Harters does not pick up garbage if there is recycling in the garbage. Tri County Fire department received their new refurbished ladder truck from Howard. Floor is refinished. Their total budget for 2023 will increase \$13,725. NEW Rescue received some ARPA funds for \$85,570. Training hours mandate was 185 hours now is 285 hours per year. Budget for 2023 will be 18.90 per capita compared to 16.92 for 2022.

Shawano County Board Supervisor ~ District 11: James Przybylski reported that the county is looking at ways to improve broadband. Also exploring options for health insurance coverage to save money for employees.

Public Comments: Joe Albers asked about repaving of Lake Sandia Drive for 2023. Susan Pomprowitz talked about the cost of installing broadband. Ron Banaszynski reported of missing street signs on Town Hall/Green Valley Road and Willow/Middle intersection.

Matters for Discussion and Possible Action by Town Board in Open Session

- a. Dana Thibodeau talked about the upcoming referendum for the Pulaski Community School District. There are two referendum questions on the November 8 ballot. Question 1 is for increasing operating needs for teachers & staff, maintaining programs & services, and operating facilities. Question 2 is for school building improvement needs for growing enrollment, major, building systems, site safety, and tech-ed space. Additions needed are for Sunnyside and Hillcrest Elementary and Pulaski High School. Pulaski School has the lowest mill rate (tax levy) in the area.
- b. Discussion took place on the garbage contract between Harters and GFL. There will be a meeting on Monday, October 17 at 6pm to make a final decision.
- c. *MOTION (Van Asten/Przybylski/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY)* to approve a three year contract with Fair Market Assessments.
- d. *MOTION (Przybylski/Van Asten/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY)* to approve lowering the speed limit in the hamlet of Zachow to 25 mph. Discussion also took place on lowering the speed limit on Middle Drive and Green Valley Road. Supervisor Przybylski received several complaints about the speed limit and recommended lowering the speed limits to 45 mph for the people who walk, ride bikes, etc. Discussion from residents and the Chairperson included talk about other roads residents may want lowered, patrolling the area more, penalties or ordinances to enforce speed limits.
- e. *MOTION (Van Asten/Przybylski/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY)* to approve M & L Excavating for snow plowing Northwestern Avenue in Zachow.
- f. Chairperson Kucksdorf gave a discussion on the Assembly District 6 candidates after the meeting had adjourned.
