Monthly Meeting September 9, 2024

Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance/Roll Call/Verification of Meeting Notice: Chairperson Przybylski called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. There was a moment of silence for the memory of 911. Roll call resulted in all town officials being shown as present. The Clerk verified that the agenda was posted at the town hall, on the town's website, e-mailed to the Shawano Leader, on Friday, September 5, 2024. *MOTION (Van Asten/Eckberg/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to allow modification of the agenda if necessary.*

Approval of Prior Town Board Minutes: *MOTION (Eckberg/Van Asten/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting held on August 12, 2024 with a correction.*

Approval of Treasurer's Monthly Report: The Treasurer's report was read by Treasurer Matuszak showing balances as of August 31, 2024, of \$140,037.86 in the Premier Checking Account, \$401,522.42 in the Premier Bank Advantage Tax Account and \$523,191.42 in the CoVantage ATC Account, \$14,923.29 in the Fox Community Credit CD, \$363.42 in the CoVantage Angelica Community Park Donations Account, \$4,266.52 in the CoVantage ATC Savings Account, and \$5 in the Fox Community Credit Member Share Account. *MOTION (Eckberg/Van Asten/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY) to approve the Treasurer's report as presented.*

Correspondence & Clerk's Report: Clerk Przybylski presented correspondence received which consisted of (1) two land use permits, one for a waste storage facility, and one for a single family dwelling addition (2) nine fire incident reports (3) two managed forest law transfer orders (4) Bonduel EMS monthly report for August. Clerk Przybylski also reported on the August 13, 2024 Parisian Primary results.

Reports from Town Officers: Supervisor Van Asten reported that he installed a 911 number. Supervisor Eckberg had no report.

Town Chairman: Chairperson Przybylski reported that he attended the NEW Rescue board meeting on August 26. The ambulance runs for June were five and eight runs for July with the average response time of 8.08 minutes. The new generator was installed at the facilities, and a maintenance agreement was approved with Raddant Electric for ten years. The bridge replacement on the west end of Middle Drive has been started and the second bridge to the east will have blacktop repaved on each side of the bridge. The rumble strips will be cut on Middle Drive east of Green Valley Road. Chair Przybylski also reported that mailboxes were damaged on Middle Drive, Willow Road, Town Hall Drive, and Hillside Drive. Shawano County Sheriff's office is following up on leads. A Good Samaritan picked up two tv's in the ditch on Nichols Drive and brought them to the town hall.

Shawano County Board Supervisor ~ District 11: James Przybylski reported that there will be active shooter training for the courthouse on Friday, September 13, 2024.

Public Comments: Town residents made comments on the rumble strips on Middle Drive, slowing down traffic on roads, about lowering the speed limit on town roads, have a sheriff sit on roads to control the speed limit, when was the speed limit changed to 55 mph from 45 mph, and the amount of tanker trucks traveling on the town roads.

Matters for Discussion and Possible Action by Town Board in Open Session:

- a. Discussion took place on the road discontinuance on the end of Julius Street. Daniel Piper started talking with Shawano County to combine all his parcels of land and they said he had to talk to the town about the discontinuance of the road. Chair Przybylski will talk to adjacent land owner and get their opinion on the road discontinuance. Chair Przybylski also stated that the town will be adding a cul-de-sac and the end of Julius Street and possible paving of the road will be in the budget for 2025.
- b. Robert Ripley asked about using a smaller culvert diameter in the subdivision. Chair Przybylski and Supervisor Eckberg talked about the driveway/culvert permit given for Lot 25. It was the general consensus to have the Chair check into other sub division and what they do for sizing of culverts used.
- c. *MOTION (Przybylski/Eckberg/PASSED)* to approve the lowest estimate for a two stage furnace for the town hall at a cost of \$3,225 for Van Asten Heating & Cooling with one abstain. There was one other estimate from Olson Oil Company at a cost of \$3,500 for a single stage furnace.
- d. *MOTION (Van Asten/Eckberg/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY)* to approve 4% interest rate for 18 months for the Hillside Cemetery CD.
- e. Discussion took place on the 9-9-24A Designate a Class B Highway. Residents commented on the amount of long trucks on the roads, truck using engine braking, rumble strips, and putting up cameras to see just how many trucks there are driving on the road. Supervisor Van Asten suggested putting up No Thru Trucks, 45 mph speed limit signs, no engine braking. Chair Przybylski said that No Thru Trucks is not enforceable and would hurt local town business. Chair Przybylski made a motion to approve Ordinance Designate a Class B Highway, there was no second motion failed.
- f. Discussion took place on amending the 9-13-93A Rules for Establishing Town Roads. Some of the language is not up the town current rules and road specifications. There was a general consensus to check into bring this to the next meeting with updates.
- g. Chair Przybylski read a statement from the Town Attorney addressing the sex offender that moved into the Town of Angelica. The Town Attorney also addressed the Sex Offender Residency Ordinance that he provided to the Town for adoption at tonight's meeting. Lieutenant Jesse Sperberg gave a presentation on the process of releasing sex offender in the community. Lt. Sperberg also talked about the special notice that is needed on certain sex offender and when the special notice or restrictions are not needed. Town residents asked questions about school dropping off children and residents doing foster care. Chair Przybylski also read a statement from Julie Krause, Corrections Program Specialist, WI Sex Offender Registry, informing the town of the process of Special Bulletin Notice and why no notice was needed. This sex offender is no longer under supervisor and therefore doesn't have any specific rules about where he can live. Supervisor Van Asten asked if the sex offender moves out and decides to move back, can he? Clerk Przybylski will ask town attorney the question and bring answer to the next meeting. *MOTION (Przybylski/Van Asten/PASSED UNANIMOUSLY)* to approve Ordinance 9-9-24B Sexual Offender Residency Ordinance.

Specific Town Board Notice and Agenda for Upcoming Town Board Meeting: Air conditioner at the Town Hall, Ordinance Rules for Establishing Town Roads, Driveway/Culvert Ordinance, road discontinuance at the end of Julius Street. The next town board meeting will be held on Monday, October 14, 2024.
