CODE RED EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION

Shawano County has contracted with Emergency Communications Network LLC in providing the delivery of emergency notifications by phone, email or text to targeted areas or the entire county. Information will be disseminated through telephone calls, text messages, emails, and a Code RED Mobile Alert app. You can get the Code RED App for your smart phone. In order to get notified in the event of severe weather or critical emergency situations, individuals and businesses will need to register. Registration is easy and FREE. Go to www.co.shawano.wi.us and click on the Code RED icon or you can call 715-526-6774 to register.

ENCROACHMENT ON TOWN ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY

Town road r.o.w. extends thirty-three feet from the center of the road. There is to be **NO** plowing, planting, cultivating, burning of garbage or placing of objects in a town road r.o.w. State Statute 86.021 states that there are fines or county jail imprisonment for violations and in addition a violator is to pay the whole cost of restoring the ditch to its former condition. These actions can affect proper drainage and visibility and could be dangerous to equipment and its operator when cutting grass in the road r.o.w. Also, the placing of grass clippings on the traveled roadway is prohibited. Blowing grass onto the roadway can be dangerous for motorcycles and offensive to motorists having to drive over the cuttings. If anyone is found to be putting tires in the road ditches, they will be reported to the Shawano County Sheriff Department. The town also has been receiving complaints regarding the plowing or blowing of snow onto roadways. This practice (which leaves debris on the road) is illegal according to Wisconsin Statutes Sec. 346.94(5) and could result in a traffic citation as a violation. This practice is a concern for public safety as well as damage to vehicles and plowing equipment when piles of snow are left on the roadway or shoulders.

ROAD SIGNS



The town is experiencing an increase in the stealing of street signs and stop signs. If you notice that stop signs or other road signs are down, damaged or missing, please contact any of the town officials. Having all signs in place, especially in the case of stop signs, is very important to the safety of people traveling our town roads. In addition, it is not legal to disfigure any sign in the town, because of safety. Also, if you notice anyone removing or vandalizing signs, would you please report it to Shawano County Sheriff Department or any one of the town officials.

DRAINAGE PROBLEMS ON PRIVATE LANDS

The town board requests that property owners keep all-natural waterways clean and flowable on their land. When there are drainage problems occurring on private lands that are caused because natural waterways are intentionally blocked or natural vegetation such as brush and trees are obstructing the flow of water it ultimately affects the flowage of water in the town road ditches. According to Wis. State Statutes a property owner could be held responsible for property damage if caused by an obstruction.

WEIGHT & SIZE LIMITS FOR IMPLEMENTS OF HUSBANDRY AND AGRICULTURAL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES Under Option F of State Act 377, all IoH and Ag CMVs except Category B may operate on all non-posted town roads with the new standards of 23k/axle and 92k gross vehicle weight. Contact Town Chairman Richard Ferfecki for more information or to obtain a permit to exceed these standards.

BURNING POLICY IN THE TOWN OF ANGELICA

Individuals may burn lawn and garden debris and small quantities of clean-untreated wood. Clean paper waste that is **not recyclable** may also be burned. **Before burning, please obtain a copy of the Town of Angelica's policy on open burning.** It is available on the town's website or by contacting the Town Clerk. **If you anticipate any large amount of smoke, notify the Pulaski Tri-County Fire Department at 920-822-5392 and the Shawano County Sheriff at 715-526-3111** (non-emergency 24-hour phone number) **to inform them of the planned burning.** When planning any burning, please keep in mind that the town has an ordinance whereby the property owner or resident will be billed the actual cost incurred by the town for fire protection and/or alarm responses and that passersby with cell phones could call the fire department when they see smoke or fire. **It is important that the fire department and the Shawano County Sheriff Department be made aware of any planned burning.** Please note that businesses **may not do any open burning** without a wood burning facility license that can be obtained from the DNR.

DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS

Under no circumstances is the burning of materials from demolition of buildings allowed. Check with the DNR in regard to burying of stone/cement foundations to see if this is allowed in your circumstance. Call: DNR Waste & Materials at 920-662-5170.

ZONE CHANGES ~ CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS ~ VARIANCE REQUESTS

In all cases, contact the Shawano County Planning, Development and Zoning Department at 715-526-6766 as a Preliminary Consultation form has to be filled out before proceeding with any of these requests.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

Permits are required for construction of homes, additions to buildings and other buildings in the Town of Angelica. Please note that in all instances a Shawano County Land-Use Permit and a Town of Angelica Building Permit are required. Detailed information is posted on the town's website or can be obtained by contacting the town clerk.

BUILDING INSPECTION REQUIRED

New construction of one and two-family dwellings and alterations and additions to one and two-family dwellings in any twelve-month period shall obtain a UDC (Uniform Dwelling Code) building permit for such work from the building inspector in addition to the Town Building Permit. Town Building Inspector Michael Miller, Miller Inspections, LLC, and Phone: 920-428-3331 is the building inspector for the town who issues the UDC permit and does the UDC inspections. There are forfeitures of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for each day of noncompliance. Any structural changes or major changes to plumbing, HVAC, and electrical systems shall require permits. Restoration or repair of an installation to its previous code-compliant condition as determined by the building inspector is exempted from permit requirements. Residing, re-roofing, window replacement, finishing of interior surfaces and installation of cabinetry shall be exempted from permit requirements.

DOG TAGS



It is important that dog license tags be attached to your dog's collar. We have had a number of instances when the town's Animal Control person has had to pick up a lost dog and it had no identification on it. If the dog tags or another form of identification are on the dog it can more easily be returned to its owner and in addition the dog tags confirm that the dog has had its required rabies shots. The town's animal control person is Wilbert Lewis who can be reached at 920-822-5081 or 920-621-6520. Also, as a reminder, a listing of people who have

not obtained a dog license for their dog or dogs will be sent to the Shawano County District Attorney. The deadline to obtain a license before being placed on this list is April 1, 2023.

PAYMENT OF SECOND INSTALLMENT OF TAXES

Please note that the second installment of taxes due July 31, 2023 are <u>not</u> to be paid to the Town Treasurer but are to be paid to the <u>Shawano County Treasurer</u>, <u>Debra Wallace</u>, <u>Shawano County Court House</u>, <u>311 Main Street</u>, <u>Shawano WI</u> <u>54166</u>. TAX INFORMATION

Information through the Ascent Program regarding your property assessments and taxes is now available online. To access this information, go to the Shawano County website (www.co.shawano.wi.us) and click on "Maps & Land Records" – then under Land Records click on "Property/Tax Information". A screen will appear that has several fields such as Municipality – Parcel ID – Last Name - Street Number – Street Name. Enter information in any one of these fields and click on "Find Now". You will then have access to various types of information. In addition, you will be able to view/print tax bills and tax receipts.

SERVICES FOR THE AGED AND DISABLED
